Drop-Off Sites for Flood Debris

Seven drop-off sites, are now available for citizens to drop off flood debris at no charge. The closest site to District 17 residents is the Hubbards Lane Recycling Center, 595 Hubbards Lane; this site operates Thursday-Saturday from 1 p.m. until 8 p.m. **Available until April 25.** This free service is available for residents of Louisville only and does not include commercial haulers. No construction debris or yard waste will be accepted. To qualify for free drop-off, residents must present two forms of identification verifying Louisville residency.

Minutes City of Meadow Vale April 16, 2015

Mayor Hornek called the meeting to order at 7:03 PM.

OPEN MEETING

The March minutes were read, motion to approve with grammatical and spelling changes by Com. Borders, second by Com. Roberts, approved by unanimous vote.

Financial report: Treasurer Lusher presented the City of Meadow Vale February financial report. The report was reviewed. Motion to approve by Com. Borders, second by Com. Roberts. Approved by unanimous vote. The bank statements and reconciliations were available for viewing.

Report from Police Chief : There were two major snow events, residential roads were cleared well ahead of Metro maintained areas. The city has experienced some issues with teens out at night during snow days. Lots of children and pets out and about – traffic needs to slow down. The unmarked Crown Victoria is fixed, the marked car is ready to be taken in. LMPD gave us two Toughbooks to replace current computers. Mandated Training is complete for a year. In-service training is scheduled. Fire Arms Spring Qualification is complete. If we decide to do the Accreditation, we will look at July for a start date.

Mayor's Report: Mayor Hornek met with the CERS lawyer and Counselor Hodge.

LEGAL

Interlocal Agreement – City of Worthington Hills: Contract is signed.

Property Taxes and Rental License Liens – will be sent a final warning, next month we will file liens against the properties.

OLD BUSINESS

Business License: Clerk is drawing up a letter to send out to the businesses.

Entrance Signs: Com. Newman is finalizing the signs. We might add a smaller sign below that says “no Thru Traffic”.

City Commission Monthly Activity:

Safety/Special Events: Ice cream social is still planned; we will have it in the same area as last year.

Streets: Com. Newman got a report about the surfacing, the initial report came back that it was applied incorrectly and at the wrong temperature. He took multiple calls from residents needing help with their driveways. The city hall building has freestanding bricks on the roof and issues with drainage that appeared during the storms.

Drainage & Website: No issues. Commissioner Roberts made some recommendations regarding the directory.

Lights & Signs/Social Issues: One light on Hounz lane that seems to be out but then comes back on again. There is one light on the corner of Somerford and Welsford that needs to be watched.

NEW BUSINESS

City Yard Sale: We will have ours with Rolling Hills, Westwood, and Briarwood. We are looking at May 16th.

2015-2016 Budget: Mayor requests that we have wants and needs prepared ahead of time so we can put together some preliminary numbers.

Com. Borders moved to adjourn at 8:07, second by Com.Roberts. Unanimously approved.

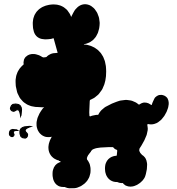
