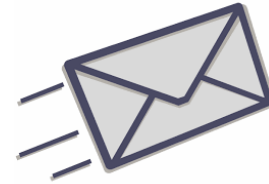
Tax Bill Changes

Reminder—Rental Application

Rental Application Fees are due on January 1st for the 2016 year. The fee is \$200 and the rental application form is available on the City of Meadow Vale website.

As a matter of operating procedure, if your tax bill is not escrowed and your tax bill mailing address is not in the city of Meadow Vale, you may be asked to provide documentation regarding your Meadow Vale residence to show that you do not have rental occupants.

Minutes City of Meadow Vale November 16, 2015

Mayor Hornek called the meeting to order at 7:03 PM.

OPEN MEETING

Judy Storm on Tiverton Drive has started a survey to request a speed hump and was able to get signatures from over 90% of the residents on that street. The Mayor recommended speed bumps like those in the City of Hurstbourne.

The October minutes were read, motion to approve with grammatical changes by Com. Roberts, second by Com. Borders, approved by unanimous vote.

Financial report: Treasurer Lusher presented the City of Meadow Vale October financial report. The report was reviewed. Motion to approve by Com. Borders, second by Com. Newman. Approved by unanimous vote. The bank statements and reconciliations were available for viewing. The monthly oversight procedures checklist will be completed monthly by Commissioner Steineker. The Block Watch has been suspended due to lack of interest.

Report from Police Chief : Chief Yates provided the December schedule. Eight calls for service, two in the city of Worthington. He has completed multiple business and house checks. We have been keeping up the 5 hours for Worthington Hills. Chief Yates also handed out candy to the kids on Halloween.

Mayor's Report: We have the estimate for the city stationery but because of the cost, we will order it a little at a time. We have an estimate on removal of the first row of burning bushes and clean up of taxus bushes to gain clearance.

Counselor Ritsert said that we will not have to amend the budget. because the line items were at or under the published amounts. We were under on the operations items, but over on the police department items.

Checks will be available on Wednesday at Mayor's house. We have found three people willing to serve on the Ethics committee: Delson Craig, Betsy Smith, and Donald Aberli. Motion to have ethics training from KLC and to set up the Ethics committee with the previously mentioned residents by Comm. Newman, second by Com. Steineker. Approved by unanimous vote. They will be officially appointed. Mayor Hardy at Rolling Hills has resigned her position.

LEGAL

Ordinances: Codification papers have been mailed.

Property taxes: Letters have been drafted and Counsel was waiting on clarification on one property.

OLD BUSINESS

Ethics Ordinance Signatures: Mayor Hornek collected the ethics ordinance signature pages from each commissioner.

Code Enforcement Forms: Commissioner Steineker and Commissioner Newman have started drafting forms and Commissioner Roberts will look those over.

City Commission Monthly Activity:

Safety/Special Events: Commissioner Borders went to the Worthington Hills city meeting.

Streets /Signs: Signs will be cut back tomorrow. We will have to put together a spec package to solicit bids for our waste contract that ends in June. Wreaths will go up next weekend.

Drainage & Website: Commissioner Roberts sent the message regarding the issues. The cover has been shifted back on Hounz lane but the access road has not been addressed. The lot at 9707 on Boxford way has some eroding issues.

Lights/Social Issues: There is one light issue on Boxford Way that Com Stieneker is watching and no social issues.

NEW BUSINESS

Discussion regarding police department.

Com. Borders moved to adjourn at 8:36, second by Com. Steineker. Unanimously approved.

No Parking On Street or Grass

The city of Meadow Vale has an ordinance prohibiting parking on the street or grass (Ordinance No. 3, Series 2002-2003)

Kentucky state law also addresses on street parking (KRS: 189.450)

Louisville Metro has an ordinance prohibiting parking on the grass (Metro Code: Chapter 72)

We understand if you have company and need the overflow of vehicles to park on the street for a short period of time. Vehicles should not be parked on the street overnight. These laws will be enforced within our city. They were put into place to protect the safety of our citizens and our property values.

Violators of these laws will be fined and subject to towing.
