REGULAR CITY COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES
07-20-2026
7:00PM – 8:13PM

The Commission met in regular session at City Hall with Mayor Matthew Hammond and the following Commissioners:

Commissioner Mike Jones
Commissioner Bill Pearce
Commissioner Katie Talbott
Commissioner James Wallover

Others present: City Attorney Kerry Butler, City Treasurer Chris Lusher, Office Manager Pat Teeter and City Clerk Barbie Bryant. Citizen in attendance was Mary Jones.

Mayor Hammond called the meeting to order at 7:00pm and proceeded with the pledge of allegiance.

MINUTES

The minutes from the 06-15-2026 regular meeting were presented. **UPON MOTION OF COMMISSIONER WALLOVER, DULY SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER PEARCE, THE MINUTES FOR THE 06-15-2026 REGULAR MEETING WERE APPROVED AND CARRIED BY A VOTE OF 5-0.**

FINANCIAL REPORT

Treasurer Lusher presented the Income Statements and the Balance Sheets for June 2026. **UPON MOTION OF COMMISSIONER PEARCE, DULY SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WALLOVER, THE INCOME STATEMENTS AND BALANCE SHEETS FOR JUNE 2026 WERE APPROVED AND CARRIED BY A VOTE OF 5-0.**

The minutes will show that the bank statements were available for review and that Commissioner Pearce had completed the oversight checklist.

POLICE REPORT

Police Chief Bacon distributed his monthly report to the Commission prior to the meeting. Commissioner Wallover reported that Officer Mike Kuzma will leave the department on July 29, 2026. Mayor Hammond reported that Chief Bacon will begin the process to recruit a new officer.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

Mayor Hammond was made aware of a complaint that involved “barking” dogs. Clerk Bryant sent a message to Code Enforcement Officer George Stewart, who responded within the hour with a response that he would address the situation.

MAYOR’S REPORT

Mayor Hammond opened the conversation related to finding a replacement for the position of City Clerk. Clerk Bryant had given notice to Mayor Hammond that her last day would be July 31, 2026. Under the direction of Mayor Hammond, Clerk Bryant sent the “help wanted” notice to the Kentucky League of Cities to post on their website and to the KIPDA Regional Clerks’ website. Clerk Bryant declared her willingness to remain available for training and other responsibilities through a contract for services. **UPON MOTION OF MAYOR HAMMOND, DULY SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER JONES, THE RECOMMENDATION TO OFFER A 90-DAY “CONTRACT FOR SERVICES” BEGINNING AUGUST 4, 2026, FOR A RATE OF \$25/HOUR TO BARBIE BRYANT WAS APPROVED AND CARRIED BY A VOTE OF 5-0.**

Mayor Hammond was pleased with the mailer provided to all residents of Meadow Vale from Current Waste Solutions (CWS). He encouraged all residents to keep the flyer handy, since it did contain ways to contact CWS for questions or concerns.

An issue about reducing services provided by the city was mentioned at the June meeting. The Commission discussed which, if any, services could be eliminated and their impact on the city.

SOLID WASTE USER FEE

Clerk Bryant reported that one property on Hounz Lane still had not paid their annual fee. CWS will not deliver new cans to the address until the Solid Waste User Fee for 2026 has been paid.

2025 PROPERTY TAX PAYMENT UPDATES

Clerk Bryant reported that seven (7) properties had liens placed for non-payment of the property tax for 2025 in March. To-date, there are still five (5) properties that have not paid or contacted the city.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Commissioner Wallover (Public Safety) – no additional information to report

Commissioner Talbott (Community Services)

- The Fall Festival will be held on September 20, 2026, from 3:00-5:00pm. She is working on securing the necessary insurance to cover the vendors (inflatables and Farmer Steve.) She proposes a budget of \$1,500. **UPON MOTION OF MAYOR HAMMOND, DULY SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER JONES, THE RECOMMENDATION TO APPROVE A BUDGET OF \$1,500.00 FOR THE FALL FESTIVAL WAS APPROVED AND CARRIED BY A VOTE OF 5-0.**

Commissioner Jones complimented Commissioner Talbott for the role she played with the success of the 4th of July Parade. The event was well attended and the extra food, supplies and activities were appreciated.

Commissioner Jones (Public Services)

- Presented a comprehensive outline of snow removal services that could be provided by four (4) companies. He would like to invite a representative from each company to a Commission meeting to discuss their proposal.
- With the help of Commissioner Pearce, will repair a stop sign at the corner of Tiverton Way and Aylesbury.

Commissioner Pearce (Utilities)

- Would like the city to invest in a chainsaw to help with the removal of trees on the berm. **UPON MOTION OF COMMISSIONER JONES, DULY SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER TALBOTT, THE RECOMMENDATION TO APPROVE AN AMOUNT UP TO \$200 FOR THE PURCHASE OF A 12", 24 VOLT, KOBALT CHAINSAW WAS APPROVED AND CARRIED BY A VOTE OF 5-0.**
- Discussed the possibility of freezing property taxes for Meadow Vale residents 65 years of age and older.

ADJOURNMENT

UPON MOTION OF MAYOR HAMMOND, DULY SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER TALBOTT, THE RECOMMENDATION TO ADJOURN THE MEETING AT 8:13PM WAS APPROVED AND CARRIED BY A VOTE OF 5-0.

Your New Carts Are On The Way

One garbage and one recycling cart will arrive the same day, July 22–24, 2026. Roll your new carts to the curb for your first trash, recycling and yard waste pickup on **Monday, August 3, 2026**.

OLD CARTS WILL BE PICKED UP BY CURRENT PROVIDER AFTER LAST SERVICE JULY 27

COLLECTION SCHEDULE

Collection days: Monday (trash, recycling and yard waste)— have carts at the curb by 6:00 AM

Service	Frequency
Trash	Weekly on Monday
Recycling	Bi-Weekly on Monday
Yard waste	Weekly on Monday, March - December (Christmas trees included the 2 weeks after)
Holidays	The Big 6 Holidays are observed and may shift collection days — check our website and socials for the current calendar

Cart placement: Lids closed, not overloaded. Wheels toward your home, 3 ft of clearance, clear of cars, fences, and mailboxes. Never include hazardous waste, liquids, or chemicals.

TRASH CART

What you CAN place in your trash cart	What you CANNOT place in your trash cart
• Bagged household trash and food scraps • Non-recyclable plastics (#3–#7) • Diapers and pet waste (bagged) • Small broken household items • Non-recyclable paper • Packaging materials • Non-hazardous debris	• Paint, oil, or chemicals • Large electronics • Construction debris (wood, tile, drywall) • Car parts or heavy scrap metal • Hot ashes or coals • Batteries and propane tanks • Medical sharps

RECYCLING CART

Included, collected bi-weekly. Keep items loose (not bagged), empty, and rinsed — no trash in recycling carts.

Accepted recycling materials	Non-recyclable items
• Paper: mail, magazines, newspapers, office paper • Cereal and tissue boxes • Cardboard (flattened) • #1–#2 plastic bottles and jugs only • Aluminum cans and steel (tin) cans • Clear, green, and brown glass bottles/jars (rinsed)	• #3–#7 plastics, bags, and film • Styrofoam / foam packaging • Food waste, liquids, greasy pizza boxes • Batteries or electronics • Clothing or textiles • Hoses, cords, wires, light bulbs, ceramics, mirrors

Why it matters: One contaminated item can get a whole load rejected. When in doubt, throw it out.

YARD WASTE (WEEKLY, March - December)

Accepts grass clippings, shrub and tree trimmings, gutter debris, and yard vegetation.

- Use your own container or paper bags, clearly marked **“Yard Waste.”**
- Bundles should be under 4 ft long and 2 in in diameter.
- **Limit per pickup:** 6 bags, OR 2 standard 32-gallon containers (no grab bar), OR 1 standard 64-gallon container (with grab bar).
- No container or bag should weigh more than 50 lbs.
- **Christmas trees included** — remove ornaments and set the tree at the curb the 2 weeks following Christmas.

BULK ITEM PICKUP — ONE FREE ITEM PER WEEK

One bulk item per household, per week, at no charge — must be pre-scheduled and will be collected on your normal day. Wrap cloth items (mattresses, sofas) in plastic. Oversized items (stoves, refrigerators) are case-by-case and charged to the resident. **Request pickup on our website or by phone (call/text).**

Not accepted: hazardous waste, construction debris, automotive parts, medical waste, and excessively heavy items (pianos, safes)
