The Commission met in regular session at City Hall with Mayor Matthew Hammond and the following Commissioners:

Commissioner Mike Jones
Commissioner Bill Pearce
Commissioner Katie Talbott
Commissioner James Wallover

Others present: City Attorney Kerry Butler, City Treasurer Chris Lusher, and Office Manager Pat Teeter. Barbie Bryant recorded the minutes. Citizen in attendance was Mary Jones.

Mayor Hammond called the meeting to order at 7:00pm and proceeded with the pledge of allegiance.

Karrer Construction representatives Zane and Ryan Karrer were introduced by Commissioner Jones. They made a presentation regarding snow removal. Commissioner Talbott had several questions concerning the age of the equipment, salt reserves and timetable for the work to begin once the weather brings snow.

MINUTES

The minutes from the 07-20-2026 regular meeting were presented. **UPON MOTION OF COMMISSIONER PEARCE, DULY SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER JONES, THE MINUTES FOR THE 07-20-2026 REGULAR MEETING WERE APPROVED AND CARRIED BY A VOTE OF 5-0.**

FINANCIAL REPORT

Treasurer Lusher presented the Income Statements and the Balance Sheets for July 2026. Commissioner Talbott asked what the procedure is for checks that have not been cashed. Treasurer Lusher explained that the reference she saw during her review of the oversight checklist was not uncashed checks, but monthly allocations for future anticipated invoices, i.e., Songer Website Design.

UPON MOTION OF COMMISSIONER WALLOVER, DULY SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER TALBOTT, THE INCOME STATEMENTS AND BALANCE SHEETS FOR JULY 2026 WERE APPROVED AND CARRIED BY A VOTE OF 5-0.

The minutes will show that the bank statements were available for review and that Commissioner Talbott will complete the oversight checklist.

POLICE REPORT/ CODE ENFORCEMENT

Police Chief Bacon distributed his monthly report to the Commission prior to the meeting. Commissioner Wallover reported that Chief Bacon will begin interviewing department officers for the position of Sergeant. Commissioner Pearce questioned the patrol of Ollies in the Rolling Hills Shopping Center. Mayor Hammond and Chief Bacon have instructed the officers to discontinue that patrol. The City of Rolling Hills cancelled the contract for Police Patrol several months ago. Mayor Hammond assured the Commissioners that the parking issue at the corner of Boxford Way and Somerford Court has been rectified. Commissioner Jones reported that speeding on Hounz Lane has escalated. Mayor Hammond will bring the “radar” speed sign back to the area. Commissioner Wallover will follow up with Chief Bacon on when the drug bust monies will be released.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Hammond received an invoice from the Jefferson County League of Cities (JCLC) for the annual membership dues of \$200.00. **UPON MOTION OF COMMISSIONER JONES, DULY SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WALLOVER, THE RECOMMENDATION TO CANCEL THE MEMBERSHIP WITH THE JCLC FOR THIS YEAR WAS APPROVED AND CARRIED BY A VOTE OF 5-0.**

Mayor Hammond will be working on the Worker's Comp self-audit with Treasurer Lusher.

CITY CLERK POSITION

Mayor Hammond has reviewed four (4) candidates and presented the Commission with the resume from Marcia Finley, former clerk at the City of Taylorsville. He felt she was the most qualified and after talking with her, she was interested in the position. **UPON MOTION OF COMMISSIONER JONES, DULY SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WALLOVER, THE RECOMMENDATION TO OFFER THE POSITION OF CITY CLERK TO MARCIA FINLEY WAS APPROVED AND CARRIED BY A VOTE OF 4-1.** Commissioner Pearce voted no.

2026 PROPERTY TAX

The "owners" property tax bills are ready to mail. The bills that are tied to an escrow account will be delivered to the mortgage companies as they are requested.

CITY HALL RELOCATION PROJECT

Mayor Hammond is continuing to research areas within the city's boundaries for a location. Discussion followed on the suggestion to purchase a residential property vs. renting a business location.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Commissioner Wallover (Public Safety) – no additional information to report

Commissioner Talbott (Community Services)

- The Fall Festival will be held on September 20, 2026, from 3:00-5:00pm. She has received the special permit for the bouncy houses. Donations have been confirmed.
- The proposed Halloween Contest will need a budget of \$100.00 **UPON MOTION OF COMMISSIONER JONES, DULY SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER PEARCE, THE RECOMMENDATION TO APPROVE AN AMOUNT UP TO \$100 FOR THE HALLOWEEN CONTEST WAS APPROVED AND CARRIED BY A VOTE OF 5-0.**

Commissioner Jones (Public Services)

- Presented the contract from Karrer Construction. **COMMISSIONER JONES MOVED TO ALLOW MAYOR HAMMOND TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH KARRER CONSTRUCTION FOR SNOW REMOVAL FOR THE MONTHS COVERING 2026-2027. COMMISSIONER TALBOTT SECONDED THE MOTION. THE MOTION CARRIED BY A VOTE OF 5-0.**

Commissioner Pearce (Utilities)

- Purchased the Kobalt 12" chainsaw to cut down the trees on the berm.
- Will be painting the concrete wall when the weather turns cooler

MISCELLANEOUS

The Financial Interest Statements (FIS) were distributed to those Commissioner who are running in the November Election. All “candidates” must submit the FIS to the City of Meadow Vale.

ADJOURNMENT

UPON MOTION OF MAYOR HAMMOND, DULY SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER JONES, THE RECOMMENDATION TO ADJOURN THE MEETING AT 7:57PM WAS APPROVED AND CARRIED BY A VOTE OF 5-0.

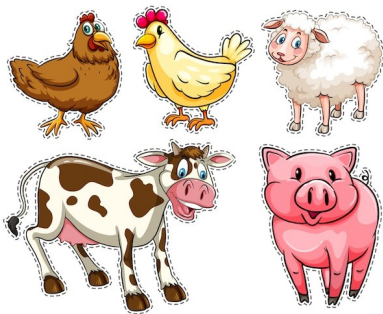

Safety Report

JULY 2026

(Presented at the August Commission meeting)

Activity:

Patrols for Meadow Vale and contracted city areas. All contracted cities received the hours of patrol as warranted.

Enforcement Actions:

- 2 - Improper Parking Warnings Issued
- 5 - Stop Signs 2 warnings, and 2 written citations Meadow Vale
- 3 - Suspicious Vehicle Reported Hounz Lane park (vehicle occupied by owners) after hours left without incident.
- 3 - traffic stops in **Old Brownsboro Farms City** 2 warnings for parking on roadway, 2 citations issued.
- 2 - warnings citations issued Indian Springs. Meadow Brook Farms: 1 written warning citation for parking on the roadway.

Training: All officers have been scheduled for m2026 In-Service training.

Homeless: 2 caught sleeping behind dumpster on Ollie's property. 1 male and female both subjects checked for warrants, asked to leave and never return. Subjects advised, they will be charged with Criminal trespassing.

Departmental Vehicles - Maintenance:

Dodge Charger: replaced alternator

2011 Ford Crown Vic: Still waiting on Mr. Evans to give me date for dropping off Crown Vic so all equipment and striping can be removed.

Fleets: we have 2 vehicles operating 2013 Ford Taurus and 2016 Dodge Charger.

We are still waiting for a check from Ky Farm Bureau, so we can replace the 2020 Ford Explorer that was ruled totaled from car accident. We have a vehicle on (Hold still waiting to be picked up) from previous dealership.



Under Kentucky's updated school bus stop law (House Bill 7), which took effect on July 15, 2026, **all drivers traveling in both directions on multi-lane roads must stop** for an activated school or church bus stop arm unless the roadway is divided by a raised physical barrier or an unpaved median. Painted medians or center turn lanes do not exempt opposing traffic from stopping,

- **Two-Lane and Multi-Lane Roads:** Drivers in both directions must stop on two-lane roads, standard four-lane roads, and four-lane highways with a paved or painted center turn lane.
- **The Only Exception:** Opposing traffic does not need to stop only if the multi-lane road (four or more lanes) is divided by a raised physical barrier or an unpaved median.
- **Camera Enforcement:** School districts are permitted to equip buses with exterior enforcement cameras to capture drivers who illegally pass stopped buses.
- **Owner Liability:** If the exact driver cannot be identified from camera footage, a legal presumption holds the registered vehicle owner or lessee responsible for the citation.
- **Penalties:** Fines are set at \$300 for a first offense and \$500 for subsequent offenses.
